Slides 1 & 2:

- Introduce goal #13 and quickly review the 17 global goals for sustainable development.

Slide 3:

- Watch the YouTube video attached.
- Discuss the difference between climate and weather.
 - Climate is over time and weather is day to day.

Slide 4:

- Discuss some of the things that the students saw during the video that make the Earth “sick”.

Slides 5 & 6:

- Discuss what climate change means for New Brunswick.
- Go over the facts on slide.

Slide 7:

- Brainstorm a list of ideas of what YOU can do to help the Earth.

Slide 8:

- Come up with different ways that you can:
 - Reduce
 - Reuse
 - Recycle

Slide 9:

- Talk about how YOU can save electricity.
- Explain what Lights Out Lakefield will look like.
 - No lights, no iPads, no smartboards, etc.

Slide 10:

- Discuss with what these single-use plastics can be replaced.

Slide 11:

- Discuss with what these single-use plastic lunchbox items can be replaced.

Slide 12:

- Complete the Smart Notebook activity provided to you in the e-mail sent out 😊

Slide 13:

- Follow the link to write a letter as a whole class to either Justin Trudeau or Blaine Higgs. You will include what the kids would like to see from their government in regard to climate action.

- Example:
- “Dear Mr. Blaine Higgs,

We believe that our community (Quispamsis) needs to stop using single-use plastics. For example, we should no longer be using plastic bags or straws. This needs to stop! We should all be carrying reusable bags and straws with us.
